1 AN ACT Relating to the capital budget; making appropriations and
2 authorizing expenditures for capital improvements; amending RCW
3 43.19.501, 28B.15.210, 28B.15.310, 28B.20.725, 28B.30.750,
4 28B.35.370, 28B.50.360, 28B.77.070, 43.88D.010, and 43.185.050;
5 amending 2020 c 356 ss 6002, 1002, 1003, 1006, 1013, 1009, 1022,
6 1027, 5002, and 5011, and 2019 c 413 ss 1007, 1010, 1014, 1058, 1060,
7 1074, 1079, 1077, 2088, 2089, 3020, 3091, 3217, 3235, 4004, and 5011
8 (uncodified); reenacting and amending RCW 43.155.050; creating new
9 sections; repealing 2019 c 413 s 1059 (uncodified); making
10 appropriations; and declaring an emergency.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

12 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) A capital budget is hereby adopted
13 and, subject to the provisions set forth in this act, the several
14 dollar amounts hereinafter specified, or so much thereof as shall be
15 sufficient to accomplish the purposes designated, are hereby
16 appropriated and authorized to be incurred for capital projects
17 during the period beginning with the effective date of this act and
18 ending June 30, 2023, out of the several funds specified in this act.

19 (2) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this act
20 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

1 (a) "Fiscal year 2022" or "FY 2022" means the period beginning
2 July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022.

3 (b) "Fiscal year 2023" or "FY 2023" means the period beginning
4 July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023.

5 (c) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an
6 unappropriated status.

7 (d) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent
8 only for the specified purpose.

9 (3) Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this act, any
10 portion of an amount provided solely for a specified purpose that is
11 not expended subject to the specified conditions and limitations to
12 fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.

13 (4) The amounts shown under the headings "Prior Biennia," "Future
14 Biennia," and "Total" in this act are for informational purposes only
15 and do not constitute legislative approval of these amounts. "Prior
16 biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for
17 reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of
18 specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what
19 may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2023-2025
20 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not
21 necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for
22 the project or program in the future.

23 (5) "Reappropriations" in this act are appropriations and, unless
24 the context clearly provides otherwise, are subject to the relevant
25 conditions and limitations applicable to appropriations.
26 Reappropriations shall be limited to the unexpended balances
27 remaining on June 30, 2021, from the 2019-2021 biennial
28 appropriations for each project.

2 **MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7001.** RCW 43.88.031 requires the disclosure
4 of the estimated debt service costs associated with new capital bond
5 appropriations. The estimated debt service costs for the
6 appropriations contained in this act are \$55,109,992 for the
7 2021-2023 biennium, \$371,985,287 for the 2023-2025 biennium, and
8 \$530,162,797 for the 2025-2027 biennium.

9 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7002.** ACQUISITION OF PROPERTIES AND
10 FACILITIES THROUGH FINANCIAL CONTRACTS. (1) The following agencies
11 may enter into financial contracts, paid from any funds of an agency,
12 appropriated or nonappropriated, for the purposes indicated and in
13 not more than the principal amounts indicated, plus financing
14 expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW. When

24 life-cycle cost analysis will aid public entities, architects,
25 engineers, and contractors in making design and construction
26 decisions that positively impact both the initial construction cost
27 and the ongoing operating and maintenance cost of a project. To
28 ensure that the total cost of a project is accounted for and the most
29 reasonable and cost efficient design is used, agencies shall develop
30 life-cycle costs for any construction project over \$10,000,000. The
31 life-cycle costs must represent the present value sum of capital
32 costs, installation costs, operating costs, and maintenance costs
33 over the life expectancy of the project. The legislature further
34 finds the most effective approach to the life-cycle cost analysis is
35 to integrate it into the early part of the design process.

36 (2) Agencies must develop a minimum of three project alternatives
37 for use in the life-cycle cost analysis. These alternatives must be
38 both distinctly different and viable solutions to the issue being
39 addressed. Agencies must choose the most reasonable and cost-

1 effective solution, as supported by the life-cycle cost analysis. A
2 brief description of each project alternative and why it was chosen
3 must be included in the life-cycle cost analysis section of the
4 predesign.

5 (3) The office of financial management shall: (a) Make available
6 a life-cycle cost model to be used for analysis; (b) in consultation
7 with the department of enterprise services, provide assistance in
8 using the life-cycle cost model; and (c) update the life-cycle cost
9 model annually including assumptions for inflation rates, discount
10 rates, and energy rates.

11 (4) Agencies shall consider architectural and engineering firms'
12 and general contractors' experience using life-cycle costs, operating
13 costs, and energy efficiency measures when selecting an architectural
14 and engineering firm, or when selecting contractors using alternative
15 contracting methods.

16 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7005.** Agencies administering construction
17 projects with a total anticipated cost in excess of \$5,000,000, or
18 \$10,000,000 for higher education institutions, must submit progress
19 reports to the office of financial management and to the fiscal
20 committees of the house of representatives and senate. "Total
21 anticipated cost" means the sum of the anticipated cost of the
22 predesign, design, and construction phases of the project. Reports
23 must be submitted on July 1st and December 31st of each year in a
24 format determined by the office of financial management. After the
25 project is completed, agencies must also submit a closeout report
26 that identifies the total project cost and any unspent
27 appropriations.

28 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7006.** (1) Allotments for appropriations in
29 this act shall be provided in accordance with the capital project
30 review requirements adopted by the office of financial management and
31 in compliance with RCW 43.88.110. Projects that will be employing
32 alternative public works construction procedures under chapter 39.10
33 RCW are subject to the allotment procedures defined in this section
34 and RCW 43.88.110.

35 (2) Each project is defined as proposed in the legislative budget
36 notes or in the governor's budget document.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7007.** (1) The office of financial management
2 may authorize a transfer of appropriation authority provided for a
3 capital project that is in excess of the amount required for the
4 completion of such project to another capital project for which the
5 appropriation is insufficient. No such transfer may be used to expand
6 the capacity of any facility beyond that intended in making the
7 appropriation. Such transfers may be effected only between capital
8 appropriations to a specific department, commission, agency, or
9 institution of higher education and only between capital projects
10 that are funded from the same fund or account. No transfers may occur
11 between projects to local government agencies except where the grants
12 are provided within a single omnibus appropriation and where such
13 transfers are specifically authorized by the implementing statutes
14 that govern the grants.

15 (2) The office of financial management may find that an amount is
16 in excess of the amount required for the completion of a project only
17 if: (a) The project as defined in the notes to the budget document is
18 substantially complete and there are funds remaining; or (b) bids
19 have been let on a project and it appears to a substantial certainty
20 that the project as defined in the notes to the budget document can
21 be completed within the biennium for less than the amount
22 appropriated in this act.

23 (3) For the purposes of this section, the intent is that each
24 project be defined as proposed to the legislature in the governor's
25 budget document, unless it clearly appears from the legislative
26 history that the legislature intended to define the scope of a
27 project in a different way.

28 (4) A report of any transfer effected under this section, except
29 emergency projects or any transfer under \$250,000, shall be filed
30 with the legislative fiscal committees of the senate and house of
31 representatives by the office of financial management at least thirty
32 days before the date the transfer is effected. The office of
33 financial management shall report all emergency or smaller transfers
34 within thirty days from the date of transfer.

35 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7008.** (1) It is expected that projects be
36 ready to proceed in a timely manner depending on the type or phase of
37 the project or program that is the subject of the appropriation in
38 this act. Except for major projects that customarily may take more
39 than two biennia to complete from predesign to the end of

1 construction, or large infrastructure grant or loan programs
2 supporting projects that often take more than two biennia to
3 complete, the legislature generally does not intend to reappropriate
4 funds more than once, particularly for smaller grant programs, local/
5 community projects, and minor works.

6 (2) Agencies shall expedite the expenditure of reappropriations
7 and appropriations in this act in order to: (a) Rehabilitate
8 infrastructure resources; (b) accelerate environmental rehabilitation
9 and restoration projects for the improvement of the state's natural
10 environment; (c) reduce additional costs associated with acquisition
11 and construction inflationary pressures; and (d) provide additional
12 employment opportunities associated with capital expenditures.

13 (3) To the extent feasible, agencies are directed to accelerate
14 expenditure rates at their current level of permanent employees and
15 shall use contracted design and construction services wherever
16 necessary to meet the goals of this section.

17 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7009.** (1) Any building project that receives
18 over \$10,000,000 in funding from the capital budget must be built to
19 sustainable standards. "Sustainable building" means a building that
20 integrates and optimizes all major high-performance building
21 attributes, including energy efficiency, durability, life-cycle
22 performance, and occupant productivity, and minimizes greenhouse gas
23 emissions. The following design and construction attributes must be
24 integrated into the building project:

25 (a) **Employ integrated design principles:** Use a collaborative,
26 integrated planning and design process that initiates and maintains
27 an integrated project team in all stages of a project's planning and
28 delivery. Establish performance goals for siting, energy, water,
29 materials, and indoor environmental quality along with other
30 comprehensive design goals and ensures incorporation of these goals
31 throughout the design and life-cycle of the building. Consider all
32 stages of the building's life-cycle, including deconstruction.

33 (b) **Commissioning:** Employ commissioning practices tailored to the
34 size and complexity of the building and its system components in
35 order to verify performance of building components and systems and
36 help ensure that design requirements are met. This should include an
37 experienced commissioning provider, inclusion of commissioning
38 requirements in construction documents, a commissioning plan,

1 verification of the installation and performance of systems to be
2 commissioned, and a commissioning report.

3 (c) Optimize energy performance: Establish a whole building
4 performance target that takes into account the intended use,
5 occupancy, operations, plug loads, other energy demands, and design
6 to earn the ENERGY STAR targets for new construction and major
7 renovation where applicable. For new construction target low energy
8 use index. For major renovations, target reducing energy use by fifty
9 percent below prerenovations baseline.

10 (d) On-site renewable energy: Implement renewable energy
11 generation projects on agency property for agency use, when life-
12 cycle cost effective.

13 (e) High-efficiency electric equipment: Use only high-efficiency
14 electric equipment for water and space heating needs not met through
15 on-site renewable energy, when life-cycle cost effective.

16 (f) Measurement and verification: For buildings over 50,000
17 square feet, install building level electricity meters in new major
18 construction and renovation projects to track and continuously
19 optimize performance. Include equivalent meters for natural gas and
20 steam, where natural gas and steam are used. Where appropriate,
21 install dashboards inside buildings to display and incentivize
22 occupants on energy use.

23 (g) Benchmarking: Compare performance data from the first year of
24 operation with the energy design target. Verify that the building
25 performance meets or exceeds the design target. For other building
26 and space types, use an equivalent benchmarking tool.

27 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7010.** State agencies, including institutions
28 of higher education, shall allot and report full-time equivalent
29 staff for capital projects in a manner comparable to staff reporting
30 for operating expenditures.

31 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7011.** Executive Order No. 05-05,
32 archaeological and cultural resources, was issued effective November
33 10, 2005. Agencies shall comply with the requirements set forth in
34 this executive order and must consult with the department of
35 archaeology and historic preservation and affected tribes on the
36 potential effects of projects on cultural resources and historic
37 properties proposed in state-funded construction or acquisition
38 projects, including grant or pass-through funding that culminates in

1 construction or land acquisitions. Consultation with the department
2 of archaeology and historic preservation and affected tribes must be
3 initiated early in the project planning process, prior to
4 construction or taking title.

5 **Sec. 7012.** RCW 43.19.501 and 2020 c 356 s 7005 are each amended
6 to read as follows:

7 The Thurston county capital facilities account is created in the
8 state treasury. The account is subject to the appropriation and
9 allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW. Moneys in the account
10 may be expended for capital projects in facilities owned and managed
11 by the department in Thurston county.

12 During the 2019-2021 and 2021-2023 fiscal (~~biennium~~) biennia,
13 the Thurston county capital facilities account may be appropriated
14 for costs associated with staffing to support capital budget and
15 project activities and lease and facility oversight activities.

16 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7013.** FOR THE ARTS COMMISSION—ART WORK
17 ALLOWANCE. (1) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this
18 act for original construction of school plant facilities is provided
19 solely for the purposes of RCW 28A.335.210.

20 (2) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act
21 for original construction or any major renovation or remodel work
22 exceeding \$200,000 by colleges or universities is provided solely for
23 the purposes of RCW 28B.10.027.

24 (3) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act
25 for original construction of any public building by a state agency
26 identified in RCW 43.17.200 is provided solely for the purposes of
27 RCW 43.17.200.

28 (4) At least eighty percent of the moneys spent by the Washington
29 state arts commission during the 2021-2023 biennium for the purposes
30 of RCW 28A.335.210, 28B.10.027, and 43.17.200 must be expended solely
31 for direct acquisition of works of art. Except for art allocations
32 made under K-3 class size reduction grants under section 5023 of this
33 act, art allocations not expended within the ensuing two biennia will
34 lapse. The commission may use up to \$200,000 of this amount to
35 conserve or maintain existing pieces in the state art collection.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7014.** To carry out the provisions of this
2 act, the governor may assign responsibility for predesign, design,
3 construction, and other related activities to any appropriate agency.

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7015.** If any federal moneys appropriated by
5 this act for capital projects are not received by the state, the
6 department or agency to which the moneys were appropriated may
7 replace the federal moneys with funds available from private or local
8 sources. No replacement may occur under this section without the
9 prior approval of the director of financial management in
10 consultation with the senate ways and means committee and the house
11 of representatives capital budget committee.

12 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7016.** (1) Unless otherwise stated, for all
13 appropriations under this act that require a match of nonstate money
14 or in-kind contributions, the following requirement, consistent with
15 RCW 43.88.150, shall apply: Expenditures of state money shall be
16 timed so that the state share of project expenditures never exceeds
17 the intended state share of total project costs.

18 (2) Provision of the full amount of required matching funds is
19 not required to permit the expenditure of capital budget
20 appropriations for phased projects if a proportional amount of the
21 required matching funds is provided for each distinct, identifiable
22 phase of the project.

23 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7017.** NONTAXABLE AND TAXABLE BOND PROCEEDS.
24 Portions of the appropriation authority granted by this act from the
25 state building construction account, or any other account receiving
26 bond proceeds, may be transferred to the state taxable building
27 construction account as deemed necessary by the state finance
28 committee to comply with the federal internal revenue service rules
29 and regulations pertaining to the use of nontaxable bond proceeds.
30 Portions of the general obligation bond proceeds authorized by
31 chapter . . ., Laws of 2021, (Z-0106/21 (State General Bonds and
32 General Accounts)) for deposit into the state taxable building
33 construction account that are in excess of amounts required to comply
34 with the federal internal revenue service rules and regulations shall
35 be deposited into the state building construction account. The state
36 treasurer shall submit written notification to the director of
37 financial management if it is determined that a shift of

1 appropriation authority between the state building construction
2 account, or any other account receiving bond proceeds, and the state
3 taxable building construction account is necessary, or that a shift
4 of appropriation authority from the state taxable building
5 construction account to the state building construction account may
6 be made.

7 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7018.** (1) Minor works project lists are
8 single line appropriations that include multiple projects of a
9 similar nature and that are valued between \$25,000 and \$1,000,000
10 each, with the exception of higher education minor works projects
11 that may be valued up to \$2,000,000. Funds appropriated in this act
12 for minor works may not be initially allotted until agencies submit
13 project lists to the office of financial management for review and
14 approval.

15 (2) Revisions to the project lists, including the addition of
16 projects and the transfer of funds between projects, are allowed but
17 must be submitted to the office of financial management, the house of
18 representatives capital budget committee, and the senate ways and

5 improvements of no more than twenty-five percent of the individual
6 minor works preservation project cost.

7 (e) Improvements for accessibility in compliance with the
8 Americans with disabilities act may be included in any of the minor
9 works categories.

10 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7019. FOR THE STATE TREASURER—TRANSFERS**

11 (1) State Building Construction Account: For transfer
12 to the drinking water assistance account, up to
13 \$5,500,000 for fiscal year 2022 and up to \$5,500,000 for
14 fiscal year 2023 \$11,000,000

15 (2) State Taxable Building Construction Account: For
16 transfer to the statewide broadband account, for
17 fiscal year 2022. \$24,000,000

18 (3) Public Works Assistance Account: For transfer
19 to the statewide broadband account, \$10,500,000 for fiscal
20 year 2022 and \$10,500,000 for fiscal year 2023. \$21,000,000

21 (4) State Taxable Building Construction Account: For
22 transfer to the water pollution control revolving
23 account, up to \$7,500,000 for fiscal year 2022 and
24 up to \$7,500,000 for fiscal year 2023. \$15,000,000

25 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7020.** To the extent that any appropriation
26 authorizes expenditures of state funds from the state building
27 construction account, or from any other capital project account in
28 the state treasury, for a capital project or program that is
29 specified to be funded with proceeds from the sale of bonds, the
30 legislature declares that any such expenditures for that project or
31 program made prior to the issue date of the applicable bonds are
32 intended to be reimbursed from proceeds of those bonds in a maximum
33 amount equal to the amount of such appropriation.

34 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7021.** In order to accelerate the reduction of
35 embodied carbon and improve the environmental performance of
36 construction materials, agencies shall, whenever possible, review and
37 consider embodied carbon reported in environmental product

1 declarations when evaluating proposed structural materials for
2 construction projects.

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7022.** Consistent with Z-0136/21 (Wage Freeze
4 and Furlough), agencies must track and manage any savings resulting
5 from furloughs and nonimplementation of wage increases. Agencies must
6 report all such program and project savings for fiscal year 2022 to
7 the office of financial management by September 1, 2020, and must
8 report actual and projected program and project savings for fiscal
9 year 2023 to the office of financial management by June 30, 2023. If

18 (d) Major stand-alone campus infrastructure projects;

19 (e) Projects that promote economic growth and innovation through
20 expanded research activity. The acquisition and installation of
21 specialized equipment is authorized under this category; and

22 (f) Other project categories as determined by the office of
23 financial management in consultation with the legislative fiscal
24 committees.

25 (2) The office of financial management, in consultation with the
26 legislative fiscal committees, shall establish a scoring system and
27 process for each four-year project category that is based on the
28 framework used in the community and technical college system of
29 prioritization. Staff from the state board for community and

18 the project proposal and scoring process as part of its biennial

12 (e) Administrative costs for housing assistance groups or
13 organizations when such grant or loan will substantially increase the
14 recipient's access to housing funds other than those available under
15 this chapter;

16 (f) Shelters and related services for the homeless, including
17 emergency shelters and overnight youth shelters;

18 (g) Mortgage subsidies, including temporary rental and mortgage
19 payment subsidies to prevent homelessness;

20 (h) Mortgage insurance guarantee or payments for eligible
21 projects;

22 (i) Down payment or closing cost assistance for eligible first-
23 time home buyers;

24 (j) Acquisition of housing units for the purpose of preservation
25 as low-income or very low-income housing;

26 (k) Projects making housing more accessible to families with
27 members who have disabilities; and

28 (l) Remodeling and improvements as required to meet building
29 code, licensing requirements, or legal operations to residential
30 properties owned and operated by an entity eligible under RCW
31 43.185A.040, which were transferred as described in RCW
32 82.45.010(3)(t) by the parent of a child with developmental
33 disabilities.

34 (3) Preference must be given for projects that include an early
35 learning facility.

36 (4) Legislative appropriations from capital bond proceeds may be
37 used only for the costs of projects authorized under subsection
38 (2)(a), (i), and (j) of this section, and not for the administrative
39 costs of the department, except that during the 2021-2023 fiscal
40 biennium, the department may use up to three percent of the

1 appropriations from capital bond proceeds for administrative costs
2 associated with application, distribution, and project development
3 activities of the housing assistance program.

4 (5) Moneys from repayment of loans from appropriations from
5 capital bond proceeds may be used for all activities necessary for
6 the proper functioning of the housing assistance program except for
7 activities authorized under subsection (2)(b) and (c) of this

9 (6) Administrative costs associated with application,
10 distribution, and project development activities of the department
11 may not exceed three percent of the annual funds available for the

16 monitoring activities of the department may not exceed one-quarter of
17 one percent annually of the contracted amount of state investment in

20 loan revolving account is created in the custody of the state
21 treasurer. All receipts from moneys directed by law to the account

3 initially be appointed to terms as follows: Two members for two-year
4 terms, and three members for three-year terms that must include the

7 members of the board must elect one of their members to serve as vice
8 chair.

9 (c) The department of transportation must provide management
10 services, including fiscal and contract services, to assist the board
11 in implementing this section.

12 (d) If a vacancy occurs by death, resignation, or otherwise of
13 appointive members of the board, the secretary of transportation must
14 fill the vacancy for the unexpired term. Members of the board may be
15 removed for malfeasance or misfeasance in office, upon specific
16 written charges by the secretary of transportation, under chapter
17 34.05 RCW.

18 (e) A member appointed by the secretary of transportation may not
19 be absent from more than 50 percent of the regularly scheduled
20 meetings in any one calendar year. Any member who exceeds this
21 absence limitation has withdrawn from the board and may be replaced
22 by the secretary of transportation.

23 (f) A majority of members currently appointed constitutes a
24 quorum.

25 (g) The board must meet three times a year or as deemed necessary
26 by the department of transportation.

27 (h) The department of transportation must provide staff support
28 as needed.

29 (2) In addition to other applicable provisions of law pertaining
30 to conflicts of interest of public officials, any community aviation
31 revitalization board member, appointive or otherwise, may not
32 participate in any decision on any board contract in which the board
33 member has any interests, direct or indirect, with any firm,
34 partnership, corporation, or association that would be the recipient
35 of any aid under this section. If such participation occurs, the
36 board must void the transaction and the involved member is subject to
37 further sanctions as provided by law. The board must adopt a code of
38 ethics for its members, which must be designed to protect the state
39 and its citizens from any unethical conduct by the board.

40 (3) The community aviation revitalization board may:

1 (a) Adopt bylaws for the regulation of its affairs and the
2 conduct of its business;

5 (d) Accept from any federal agency loans or grants for the
6 planning or financing of any project and enter into an agreement with
7 the agency respecting the loans or grants;

8 (e) Conduct examinations and investigations and take testimony at
9 public hearings of any matter material for its information that will
10 assist in determinations related to the exercise of the board's
11 lawful powers;

12 (f) Accept any gifts, grants, loans of funds, property, or
13 financial or other aid in any form from any other source on any terms
14 and conditions that are not in conflict with this section;

15 (g) Enter into agreements or other transactions with and accept
16 grants and cooperation from any governmental agency in furtherance of
17 this section;

18 (h) Adopt rules under chapter 34.05 RCW as necessary to carry out
19 the purposes of this section; and

20 (i) Perform all acts and things necessary or convenient to carry
21 out the powers expressly granted or implied under this section.

22 (4)(a)(i) The community aviation revitalization board may make
23 direct loans to airport sponsors of public use airports in the state
24 for the purpose of airport improvements that primarily support
25 general aviation activities. The board may provide loans for the
26 purpose of airport improvements only if the state is receiving
27 commensurate public benefit, which must include, as a condition of
28 the loan, a commitment to provide public access to the airport for a
29 period of time equivalent to one and one-half times the term of the
30 loan.

31 (ii) For purposes of this subsection (4)(a), "public use
32 airports" means all public use airports not listed as having more
33 than \$75,000 annual commercial air service passenger enplanements as
34 published by the federal aviation administration.

35 (b) An application for loan funds under this section must be made
36 in the form and manner that the board prescribes. When evaluating
37 loan applications, the board must prioritize applications that
38 provide conclusive justification that completion of the loan
39 application project will create revenue-generating opportunities. The

1 board is not limited to, but must also use, the following expected
2 outcome conditions when evaluating loan applications:

3 (i) A specific private development or expansion is ready to occur
4 and will occur only if the aviation facility improvement is made;

5 (ii) The loan application project results in the creation of jobs
6 or private sector capital investment as determined by the board;

7 (iii) The loan application project improves opportunities for the
8 successful maintenance, operation, or expansion of an airport or
9 adjacent airport business park;

10 (iv) The loan application project results in the creation or
11 retention of long-term economic opportunities; and

12 (v) The loan application project results in leveraging additional
13 federal funding for an airport.

14 (c) (i) If the board chooses to require a local match, the board
15 must develop guidelines for local participation and allowable match
16 and activities.

17 (ii) An application must:

18 (A) Be supported by the port district, city, or county in which
19 the project is located; or

20 (B) Clearly identify the source of funds intended to repay the
21 loan.

22 (5) The public use general aviation airport loan program, when
23 authorized by the community aviation revitalization board, is subject
24 to the following conditions:

25 (a) The moneys in the public use general aviation airport loan
26 revolving account created in section 7034 of this act must be used
27 only to fulfill commitments arising from loans authorized in this
28 section. The total outstanding amount that the board must dispense at
29 any time pursuant to this section must not exceed the moneys
30 available from the account.

31 (b) On contracts made for public use general aviation airport
32 loans, the board must determine the interest rate that loans must
33 bear. The interest rate must not exceed the amount needed to cover
34 the administrative expenses of the board and the loan program. The
35 board may provide reasonable terms and conditions for the repayment
36 of loans, with the repayment of a loan to begin no later than three
37 years after the award date of the loan. The loans must not exceed 20
38 years in duration.

39 (c) The repayment of any loan made from the public use general
40 aviation airport loan revolving account under the contracts for

1 aviation loans must be paid into the public use general aviation
2 airport loan revolving account.

3 (6) All receipts from moneys collected under this section must be
4 deposited into the public use general aviation airport loan revolving
5 account.

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7036.** If any provision of this act or its
7 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
8 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
9 persons or circumstances is not affected.

10 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7037.** This act is necessary for the immediate
11 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of
12 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes
13 effect immediately.
