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SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5884

- AN ACT Relating to establishing behavioral health support specialists; amending RCW 18.130.040 and 18.130.040; adding a new chapter to Title 18 RCW; providing an effective date; and providing an expiration date.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that the behavioral 7 health support specialist is a new service delivery model 8 Washington state based on improving access to psychological therapies (IAPT), an evidence-based model developed by the national health 9 10 service in England. IAPT services are characterized by evidenced-11 based psychological therapies, delivered by trained and accredited 12 practitioners with training matched to the intensity and expected 13 duration of the mental health problem. The model features routine 14 outcome monitoring and regular, outcome-focused supervision. Use of 15 behavioral health support specialists in Washington is expected to 16 improve access to behavioral health services and ease workforce 17 shortages while helping behavioral health professionals work at the 18 top of their scope of practice.

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- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. The definitions in this section apply throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires otherwise.
 - (1) "Applicant" means a person who completes the required application, pays the required fee, is at least 18 years of age, and meets any background check requirements and uniform disciplinary act requirements.
 - (2) "Behavioral health support specialist" means a trained paraprofessional certified under this chapter to deliver low-intensity, evidence-based behavioral health interventions for adults with mild-to-moderate behavioral health conditions in a stepped care model in ongoing partnership with a licensed health care provider whose scope of practice includes behavioral health or a licensed community behavioral health agency. A behavioral health support specialist does not have within their scope the ability to make diagnoses but does track and monitor treatment response and outcomes using measurement-based care.
- 18 (3) "Department" means the department of health.

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- 19 (4) "Secretary" means the secretary of health or the secretary's designee.
- 21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** The department shall partner with the 22 University of Washington department of psychiatry and behavioral sciences and consult with other stakeholders including the Washington 23 24 state council on behavioral health to develop rules to implement this chapter by January 1, 2024, which shall be consistent with the 25 evidence-based improving access to psychological therapies model, and 26 27 shall include appropriate standards for accreditation of educational 28 programs for behavioral health support specialists, which shall 29 include a practicum component and may be integrated into a bachelor's 30 degree program or structured as a continuing education program.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. A person may not represent themself as a behavioral health support specialist without being certified by the department.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to prohibit or restrict delivery of behavioral health interventions by an individual otherwise regulated under this title and performing services within their authorized scope of practice.

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- NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. In addition to any other authority provided by law, the secretary has the authority to:
- 3 (1) Adopt rules under chapter 34.05 RCW necessary to implement 4 this chapter. Any rules adopted shall be in consultation with the 5 University of Washington;
- 6 (2) Establish all certification, examination, and renewal fees in accordance with RCW 43.70.250;
- 8 (3) Establish forms and procedures necessary to administer this 9 chapter;
- 10 (4) Issue certifications to applicants who have met the 11 education, practicum, and examination requirements for certification 12 and to deny a certification to applicants who do not meet the 13 requirements;
- 14 (5) Develop, administer, and supervise the grading and taking of 15 an examination for applicants for certification;
- 16 (6) Adopt rules implementing a continuing education program in 17 consultation with the University of Washington;
- 18 (7) Maintain the official record of all applicants and 19 certification holders; and
- 20 (8) Establish by rule the procedures for an appeal of an 21 examination failure.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. The uniform disciplinary act, chapter 18.130 RCW, governs uncertified practice, the issuance and denial of certification, and the discipline of persons certified under this chapter. The secretary shall be the disciplinary authority under this chapter.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 8. The secretary shall issue a certification to any applicant who demonstrates to the satisfaction of the secretary that the applicant meets the following requirements:
 - (1) Graduation from a bachelor's degree program;

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- 31 (2) Successful completion of a behavioral health support 32 specialist program that is accredited to meet standards consistent 33 with the evidence-based program improving access to psychological 34 treatment, including a supervised clinical practicum with 35 demonstrated clinical skills in core competencies;
 - (3) Successful completion of an approved examination; and

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- 1 (4) Ongoing partnership with a licensed health care provider 2 whose scope of practice includes behavioral health or a licensed 3 community behavioral health agency.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 9. (1) The date and location of examinations shall be established by the secretary. Applicants who have been found by the secretary to meet the other requirements for certification shall be scheduled for the next examination following the filing of the application. The secretary shall establish by rule the examination application deadline.

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- (2) The secretary or the secretary's designee shall examine each applicant, by means determined to be most effective, on subjects appropriate to the scope of practice, as applicable. Such examinations shall be limited to the purpose of determining whether the applicant possesses the minimum skill and knowledge necessary to practice competently.
- (3) The examination papers, all grading of the papers, and the grading of any practical work shall be preserved for a period of not less than one year after the secretary has made and published the decisions. All examinations shall be conducted using fair and wholly impartial methods.
- 21 (4) The secretary may approve an examination prepared or 22 administered by a private testing agency or association of licensing 23 agencies for use by an applicant in meeting the certification 24 requirements.
 - NEW SECTION. Sec. 10. Applications for certification shall be submitted on forms provided by the secretary. The secretary may require any information and documentation which reasonably relates to the need to determine whether the applicant meets the criteria for certification provided for in this chapter and chapter 18.130 RCW. Each applicant shall pay a fee determined by the secretary under RCW 43.70.250. The fee shall accompany the application.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 11. (1) The health care authority shall take any steps which are necessary and proper to ensure that the services of behavioral health support specialists are covered under the state medicaid program by January 1, 2024. A behavioral health support specialist must be eligible to bill for behavioral health service delivery, including psychotherapy codes.

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- 1 (2) By July 1, 2024, the office of the insurance commissioner 2 shall make recommendations to health carriers regarding appropriate 3 use of behavioral health support specialists, network adequacy for 4 behavioral health support specialists, and steps to incorporate 5 behavioral health support specialists into commercial provider 6 networks.
- 7 **Sec. 12.** RCW 18.130.040 and 2021 c 179 s 6 are each amended to 8 read as follows:
