- WHEREAS, Bill Schillinger earned a bachelor's degree in Communications from Eastern Washington University, and a master's degree in Agronomy from the University of California, Davis, then worked for the United States Agency for International Development in Africa and Asia for 10 years, before returning to the United States to earn a PhD in Agronomy from Oregon State University; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Dr. Schillinger began working at the Washington State 10 University dryland research station in Lind, Washington on January 1, 11 1993; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Dr. Schillinger was the principal investigator of three 13 multidisciplinary long-term dryland and irrigated cropping systems 14 experiments; and
- WHEREAS, During Dr. Schillinger's long 15 career there, the did 16 Washington State University dryland research station 17 groundbreaking research on combatting wind erosion, including 18 conservation-till and no-till farming methods; alternative crops to 19 winter wheat and other extensive long-term research 20 including a cropping systems study 25 years in the making and a 21 winter pea study that is in its 12th year; and soil and residue 22 management practices to increase water storage and efficient use of 23 precipitation; and
