EFFECT: Removes the inflation adjustment for the maximum perpupil limit in the underlying bill and replaces it with the following maximum per-pupil limit increases:

- School districts with less than 40,000 students and a regionalization factor of 12 percent are increased to \$2,750 per pupil plus inflation.
- School districts with less than 40,000 students and a regionalization factor of 6 percent or less receive no increase.
- School districts with less than 40,000 students and a regionalization factor of 18 percent are increased to \$3,000 per pupil plus inflation.
