1 On page 9, after line 15, insert the following:

2 "NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8.** The department of licensing shall make
3 recommendations to the legislature on a licensure program for
4 independent repair providers that provide diagnosis, maintenance, and
5 repair services for digital electronic equipment. The department of
6 licensing shall submit a report to the legislature in accordance with
7 RCW 43.01.036 on its recommendations by October 31, 2023. The report
8 must address the following:

9 (1) A minimum of 25 hours of training per type of digital
10 electronic equipment in a manner specified by the original
11 manufacturer of the digital electronic equipment;

12 (2) Cybersecurity training requirements;

13 (3) Recommended training opportunities with the state's community
14 and technical colleges;

15 (4) Commercial insurance requirements that include coverage for
16 breach of a customer's personal data; and

17 (5) Continuing education requirements that include courses or
18 training in cybersecurity and how to protect a customer's personal
19 health data, financial data, and electronic images stored on digital
20 electronic equipment."

22 Renumber the remaining sections consecutively and correct any
23 internal references accordingly.

25 On page 9, line 18, after "through" strike "8" and insert "9"

27 On page 9, after line 19, insert the following:

1 "NEW SECTION. **Sec. 11.** This act shall take effect after the
2 legislature adopts a licensure program for independent repair
3 providers based on recommendations provided by the department of
4 licensing under section 8 of this act."

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6 Renumber the remaining sections consecutively and correct any
7 internal references accordingly.

9 Correct the title.

EFFECT: Requires the Department of Licensing (DOL) to make
recommendations on a licensure program for independent repair
providers who provide the services of diagnosis, maintenance, and
repair of digital electronic equipment, with a report on the
recommendations due to the legislature by October 31, 2023. Makes
the effective date of the Fair Repair Act contingent on the
legislature adopting a licensing program for independent repair
providers.

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
