11 "(a) \$22,902,000 of the general fund--state appropriation for
12 fiscal year 2024 and \$22,902,000 of the general fund-state
13 appropriation for fiscal year 2025 are provided solely for the office
14 of the superintendent of public instruction to administer grants to
15 fully subsidize the cost of dual credit programs for students who are
16 low income. Of the amounts provided in this subsection:

17 (i) \$9,953,000 of the general fund--state appropriation for fiscal
18 year 2024 and \$9,953,000 of the general fund--state appropriation for
19 fiscal year 2025 are for the office to subsidize the cost of running
20 start courses for students who are low income. Funding provided in
21 this subsection may be used for textbooks and other course materials
22 required, and for any student-voted fees, technology fees, course
23 fees, laboratory fees, or other fees required for enrollment in
24 running start courses;

25 (ii) \$9,694,000 of the general fund--state appropriation for
26 fiscal year 2024 and \$9,694,000 of the general fund--state
27 appropriation for fiscal year 2025 are for the office to subsidize the

1 cost of college in the high school tuition fees permitted under RCW
2 28A.600.287 for students who are low income;

3 (iii) \$2,824,000 of the general fund--state appropriation for
4 fiscal year 2024 and \$2,824,000 of the general fund--state
5 appropriation for fiscal year 2025 are for the office to subsidize the
6 cost for student fees related to exam registration and administration
7 for students who are low income taking advanced placement exams,
8 international baccalaureate exams, and Cambridge international exams;
9 and

10 (iv) \$180,000 of the general fund--state appropriation for fiscal
11 year 2024 and \$180,000 of the general fund--state appropriation for
12 fiscal year 2025 are for the office to subsidize transcription fees
13 assessed by institutions of higher education for career and technical
14 education dual credit courses for students who are low income."

EFFECT: Provides additional funding to OSPI to administer grants to fully subsidize the cost of dual credit programs for students who are low income. Funding is provided to fully subsidize the cost of: Running Start courses, including the cost for books, materials, and any fees; College in the High School tuition fees; Advanced Placement International Baccalaureate, and Cambridge International exam fees, and; Career and Technical Education dual credit transcription fees. Reduces the amount per state funded full-time equivalent student at The Evergreen State College to reflect the average amount for the public regional four-year universities.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Reduces General Fund - State by \$7,938,000.
