Title: An act relating to developing strategies to reduce or eliminate deductibles for maternal support services and postpartum care.

Brief Summary of Bill

- Requires the Office of the Insurance Commissioner, in collaboration with health carriers, to develop strategies to reduce or eliminate deductibles for maternity and postpartum care.

Background: Federal law requires most health plans to cover maternity services including child birth and newborn care. These plans also must cover preventative services, including prenatal visits and screenings, gestational diabetes testing, folic acid supplements, tobacco cessation counseling and interventions, and breastfeeding services, without any cost-sharing. Deductibles and other out-of-pocket expenses related to maternity and delivery services vary based on plan design, but the average out-of-pocket cost is approximately \$2,800.

Summary of Bill: The Office of the Insurance Commissioner (OIC), in collaboration with

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health carriers, must develop strategies to reduce or eliminate deductibles for maternal support services and postpartum care. By December 1, 2023, OIC must submit a report to the the Legislature outlining those strategies.

Appropriation: None.

Fiscal Note: Requested on February 6, 2023.

Effective Date: Ninety days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed.
