1 AN ACT Relating to the capital budget; amending RCW 28A.320.330,
2 28B.20.725, 28B.15.210, 28B.15.310, 28B.30.750, 28B.35.370,
3 28B.50.360, 39.35D.030, 43.07.410, 43.31.577, 43.82.010, 43.88D.010,
4 43.99N.060, 43.160.060, and 87.03.136; amending 2021 c 332 ss 1039,
5 1041, 1073, 1065, 1094, 1098, 2032, 2039, 2059, 2067, 3002, 3010,

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

15 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) A capital budget is hereby adopted
16 and, subject to the provisions set forth in this act, the several
17 dollar amounts hereinafter specified, or so much thereof as shall be
18 sufficient to accomplish the purposes designated, are hereby
19 appropriated and authorized to be incurred for capital projects
20 during the period beginning with the effective date of this act and
21 ending June 30, 2025, out of the several funds specified in this act.

1 (2) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this act
2 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

3 (a) "Fiscal year 2024" or "FY 2024" means the period beginning
4 July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024.

5 (b) "Fiscal year 2025" or "FY 2025" means the period beginning
6 July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025.

7 (c) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an
8 unappropriated status.

9 (d) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent
10 only for the specified purpose.

11 (3) Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this act, any
12 portion of an amount provided solely for a specified purpose that is
13 not expended subject to the specified conditions and limitations to
14 fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.

15 (4) The amounts shown under the headings "Prior Biennia," "Future
16 Biennia," and "Total" in this act are for informational purposes only
17 and do not constitute legislative approval of these amounts. "Prior
18 biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for
19 reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of
20 specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what
21 may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2025-2027
22 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not
23 necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for
24 the project or program in the future.

25 (5) "Reappropriations" in this act are appropriations and, unless
26 the context clearly provides otherwise, are subject to the relevant
27 conditions and limitations applicable to appropriations.
28 Reappropriations shall be limited to the unexpended balances
29 remaining on June 30, 2023, from the 2021-2023 biennial
30 appropriations for each project.

19 (a) At least 20 percent of each competitive grant round is
20 designated for award to eligible projects in small cities or towns
21 with a population of 5,000 or fewer residents.

22 (b) In each competitive round, a higher energy savings to
23 investment ratio must result in a higher project ranking. Priority
24 consideration must be given to applicants that have not received
25 grant awards for this purpose in prior biennia.

26 (c) The department must determine a minimum match ratio to
27 maximize the leverage of nonstate funds.

28 (2) (a) \$10,000,000 of the appropriation in this section is
29 provided solely for grants to be awarded in competitive rounds to
30 local governments, public higher education institutions, school
31 districts, tribal governments, and state agencies for projects that
32 involve the purchase and installation of solar energy systems,
33 including solar modules and inverters, with a preference for products
34 manufactured in Washington.

35 (b) At least 20 percent of each competitive grant round is
36 designated for award to eligible projects in small cities or towns
37 with a population of 5,000 or fewer residents.

1 (c) In each competitive round, a higher energy savings to
2 investment ratio must result in a higher project ranking. Priority
3 consideration must be given to applicants that have not received
4 grant awards for this purpose in prior biennia.

5 (d) The department must determine a minimum match ratio to
6 maximize the leverage of nonstate funds.

7 (3) \$4,000,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided
8 solely for the energy efficiency and environmental performance
9 improvements to minor works, stand-alone, and emergency projects at
10 facilities owned by agencies that repair or replace existing building
11 systems and reduce greenhouse gas emissions from state operations,
12 including, but not limited to, HVAC, lighting, insulation, windows,
13 and other mechanical systems. Eligibility for this funding is
14 dependent on an analysis using the office of financial management's
15 life-cycle cost tool that compares project design alternatives for
16 initial and long-term cost-effectiveness. Assuming a reasonable
17 return on investment, the department shall provide grants in the
18 amount required to improve the project's energy efficiency compared
19 to the original project request.

20 (4) The department shall develop metrics that indicate the
21 performance of energy efficiency efforts.

22 (5) If a grant is provided in subsection (1) or (3) of this
23 section to purchase heating devices or systems, the agency must,
24 whenever possible and most cost effective, select devices and systems
25 that do not use fossil fuels.

26 (6) Grants provided in subsections (1), (2), and (3) of this
27 section to state agencies are exempt from the match requirements in
28 this section.

36 The appropriations in this section are subject to the following
37 conditions and limitations:

1 (1) \$83,000,000 of the general fund—federal appropriation and
2 \$115,000,000 of the climate commitment account—state appropriation
3 are provided solely for the department to administer grants to
4 eligible third-party administrators for heat pump and other high-
5 efficiency electric equipment rebates, with a focus on low/moderate
6 income households and small businesses. State incentives and rebates
7 for installation of high efficiency electric equipment, including
8 electrical panel upgrades, provide a benefit to the public consistent
9 with the state's energy strategy and climate mandates by reducing
10 greenhouse gas emissions from the built environment.

11 (2) The department shall implement a statewide high efficiency
12 electric equipment program consistent with the following:

13 (a) Aid the transition of residential and commercial buildings
14 away from fossil fuels by providing education and outreach resources
15 for the installation of high efficiency electric heat pumps and other
16 high efficiency electric equipment;

17 (b) Provide grants, coordination, and technical assistance to
18 eligible third-party administrators to promote the adoption of high-
19 efficiency electric heat pump equipment for space and water heating;
20 and

21 (c) Develop strategies to ensure that the program serves low-
22 income households, vulnerable populations, and overburdened
23 communities, including dedicating a portion of the program funding
24 for this purpose. For the purposes of this subsection (2)(c),
25 "overburdened communities" has the same meaning as defined in RCW
26 70A.65.010.

27 (3) For the purposes of this section, "eligible third-party
28 administrators" include, but are not limited to, nonprofits,
29 utilities, housing providers, community action agencies and
30 community-based organizations.

1 (2) The department must establish a competitive process to
2 solicit proposals for and prioritize projects whose primary objective
3 is to assist libraries operated by governmental units, as defined in
4 RCW 27.12.010, in acquiring, constructing, repairing, or
5 rehabilitating facilities.

6 (3) The department must establish a committee to develop the
7 grant program criteria established under subsection (2) of this
8 section and review proposals. The committee must be composed of five
9 members as provided in this subsection. The committee must include:

10 (a) A representative from the department of commerce; (b) a
11 representative from the department of archaeology and historic
12 preservation; (c) the state librarian; (d) a representative from a
13 library district; and (e) a representative from a municipal library.

14 (4) The department must conduct a statewide solicitation of
15 project applications. The department must evaluate and rank
16 applications in consultation with the committee established in
17 subsection (3) of this section, using objective criteria. The ranking
18 of projects must prioritize library district facilities listed on a
19 local, state, or federal register of historic places and those
20 located in distressed or rural counties. The evaluation and ranking
21 process must also include an examination of existing assets that
22 applicants propose to apply to projects. Grant assistance under this
23 section may not exceed 50 percent of the total cost of the project.
24 The nonstate portion of the total project cost may include cash, the
25 value of real property when acquired solely for the purpose of the
26 project, and in-kind contributions.

27 (5) The department must submit a prioritized list of recommended
28 projects to the governor and the legislature by October 1, 2024, for
29 inclusion in the department of commerce's 2025-2027 biennial capital
30 budget request. The list must include a description of each project,
31 the amount of recommended state funding, and documentation of
32 nonstate funds to be used for the project. Individual grants may not
33 exceed \$2,000,000. The total amount of recommended state funding for
34 the projects on a biennial project list may not exceed \$10,000,000.

35 (6) In contracts for grants authorized under this section, the
36 department must include provisions that require that capital
37 improvements be held by the grantee for a specified period of time
38 appropriate to the amount of the grant and that facilities be used
39 for the express purpose of the grant. If the grantee is found to be

1 out of compliance with provisions of the contract, the grantee must
2 repay to the state general fund the principal amount of the grant
3 plus interest calculated at the rate of interest on state of
4 Washington general obligation bonds issued on the date most close in
5 time to the date of authorization of the grant.

6 (7) The department must assist grant recipients under this
7 section to apply for applicable competitive federal grant funding
8 and, upon receipt of any such funding, an equal amount of the state
9 building construction account—state appropriation must be placed in
10 unallotted status.

This requirement does not apply to projects where a share of the appropriation is for design costs only.

(2) Prior to receiving funds, project recipients must demonstrate that the project site is under control for a minimum of 10 years, either through ownership or a long-term lease. This requirement does not apply to appropriations for preconstruction activities or appropriations in which the sole purpose is to purchase real property that does not include a construction or renovation component.

1 (3) Projects funded in this section may be required to comply

2 **MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8001.** RCW 43.88.031 requires the disclosure
4 of the estimated debt service costs associated with new capital bond
5 appropriations. The estimated debt service costs for the
6 appropriations contained in this act are \$59,511,000 for the
7 2023-2025 biennium, \$370,419,000 for the 2025-2027 biennium, and
8 \$518,208,000 for the 2027-2029 biennium.

9 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8002.** ACQUISITION OF PROPERTIES AND
10 FACILITIES THROUGH FINANCIAL CONTRACTS. (1) The following agencies
11 may enter into financial contracts, paid from any funds of an agency,
12 appropriated or nonappropriated, for the purposes indicated and in
13 not more than the principal amounts indicated, plus financing
14 expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW. When
15 securing properties under this section, agencies shall use the most
16 economical financial contract option available, including long-term
17 leases, lease-purchase agreements, lease-development with option to
18 purchase agreements or financial contracts using certificates of
19 participation. Expenditures made by an agency for one of the
20 indicated purposes before the issue date of the authorized financial
21 contract and any certificates of participation therein are intended
22 to be reimbursed from proceeds of the financial contract and any
23 certificates of participation therein to the extent provided in the
24 agency's financing plan approved by the state finance committee.

25 (2) Those noninstructional facilities of higher education
26 institutions authorized in this section to enter into financial
27 contracts are not eligible for state funded maintenance and
28 operations. Instructional space that is available for regularly
29 scheduled classes for academic transfer, basic skills, and workforce
30 training programs may be eligible for state funded maintenance and
31 operations.

32 (3) Secretary of state: Enter into a financing contract for up to
33 \$119,000,000 plus financing expenses, required reserves, and
34 capitalized interest pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to construct a new
35 library-archives building.

36 (4) Department of social and health services: Enter into a
37 financing contract for up to \$175,888,000 plus costs and financing
38 expenses, required reserves, and capitalized interest pursuant to

1 chapter 39.94 RCW to construct a nursing facility on the Fircrest
2 residential habilitation center campus. The department may contract
3 to lease develop or lease purchase the facility. Before entering into
4 a contract, the department must consult with the office of financial
5 management and the office of the state treasurer. Should the
6 department of social and health services choose to use a financing
7 contract that does not provide for the issuance of certificates of
8 participation, the financing contract shall be subject to approval by
9 the state finance committee as required by RCW 39.94.010. In
10 approving a financing contract not providing for the use of
11 certificates of participation, the state finance committee should be
12 reasonably certain that the contract is excluded from the computation
13 of indebtedness, particularly that the contract is not backed by the
14 full faith and credit of the state and the legislature is expressly
15 not obligated to appropriate funds to make payments. For purposes of
16 this subsection, "financing contract" includes but is not limited to
17 a certificate of participation and tax exempt financing similar to
18 that authorized in RCW 47.79.140.

19 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8003.** (1) To ensure that major construction
20 projects are carried out in accordance with legislative and executive
21 intent, agencies must complete a predesign for state construction
22 projects with a total anticipated cost in excess of \$10,000,000. For
23 purposes of this section, "total anticipated cost" means the sum of
24 the anticipated cost of the predesign, design, and construction
25 phases of the project.

26 (2) Appropriations for design may not be expended or encumbered
27 until the office of financial management has reviewed and approved
28 the agency's predesign.

29 (3) The predesign must explore at least three project
30 alternatives. These alternatives must be both distinctly different
31 and viable solutions to the issue being addressed. The chosen
32 alternative should be the most reasonable and cost-effective
33 solution. The predesign document must include, but not be limited to,
34 program, site, and cost analysis, and an analysis of the life-cycle
35 costs of the alternatives explored, in accordance with the predesign
36 manual adopted by the office of financial management.

37 (4) For projects exceeding the \$10,000,000 predesign threshold
38 established in this section, the office of financial management may
39 make an exception to some or all of the predesign requirements in

1 this section. The office of financial management shall report any
2 exception to the fiscal committees of the legislature:

3 (a) A description of the major capital project for which the
4 predesign waiver is made;

5 (b) An explanation of the reason for the waiver; and

6 (c) A rough order of magnitude cost estimate for the project's
7 design and construction.

8 (5) In deliberations related to submitting an exception under
9 this section, the office of financial management shall consider the
10 following factors:

11 (a) Whether there is any determination to be made regarding the
12 site of the project;

13 (b) Whether there is any determination to be made regarding
14 whether the project will involve renovation, new construction, or
15 both;

16 (c) Whether, within six years of submitting the request for
17 funding, the agency has completed, or initiated the construction of,
18 a substantially similar project;

19 (d) Whether there is any anticipated change to the project's
20 program or the services to be delivered at the facility;

21 (e) Whether the requesting agency indicates that the project may
22 not require some or all of the predesign requirements in this section
23 due to a lack of complexity; and

24 (f) Whether any other factors related to project complexity or
25 risk, as determined by the office of financial management, could
26 reduce the need for, or scope of, a predesign.

27 (6) If under this section, some or all predesign requirements are
28 waived, the office of financial management may instead propose a
29 professional project cost estimate instead of a request for predesign
30 funding.

31 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8004.** (1) The legislature finds that use of
32 life-cycle cost analysis will aid public entities, architects,
33 engineers, and contractors in making design and construction
34 decisions that positively impact both the initial construction cost
35 and the ongoing operating and maintenance cost of a project. To
36 ensure that the total cost of a project is accounted for and the most
37 reasonable and cost-efficient design is used, agencies shall develop
38 life-cycle costs for any construction project over \$10,000,000. The
39 life-cycle costs must represent the present value sum of capital

1 costs, installation costs, operating costs, and maintenance costs
2 over the life expectancy of the project. The legislature further
3 finds the most effective approach to the life-cycle cost analysis is
4 to integrate it into the early part of the design process.

5 (2) Agencies must develop a minimum of three project alternatives
6 for use in the life-cycle cost analysis. These alternatives must be
7 both distinctly different and viable solutions to the issue being
8 addressed. Agencies must choose the most reasonable and cost-
9 effective solution, as supported by the life-cycle cost analysis. A
10 brief description of each project alternative and why it was chosen
11 must be included in the life-cycle cost analysis section of the
12 predesign.

13 (3) The office of financial management shall: (a) Make available
14 a life-cycle cost model to be used for analysis; (b) in consultation
15 with the department of enterprise services, provide assistance in
16 using the life-cycle cost model; and (c) update the life-cycle cost
17 model annually including assumptions for inflation rates, discount
18 rates, and energy rates.

19 (4) Agencies shall consider architectural and engineering firms'
20 and general contractors' experience using life-cycle costs, operating
21 costs, and energy efficiency measures when selecting an architectural
22 and engineering firm, or when selecting contractors using alternative
23 contracting methods.

24 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8005.** Agencies administering construction
25 projects with a total anticipated cost in excess of \$10,000,000 must
26 submit progress reports to the office of financial management and to
27 the fiscal committees of the house of representatives and senate.
28 "Total anticipated cost" means the sum of the anticipated cost of the
29 predesign, design, and construction phases of the project. Reports
30 must be submitted on July 1st and December 31st of each year in a
31 format determined by the office of financial management. After the
32 project is completed, agencies must also submit a closeout report
33 that identifies the total project cost and any unspent
34 appropriations.

35 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8006.** (1) Allotments for appropriations in
36 this act shall be provided in accordance with the capital project
37 review requirements adopted by the office of financial management and
38 in compliance with RCW 43.88.110. Projects that will be employing

1 alternative public works construction procedures under chapter 39.10
2 RCW are subject to the allotment procedures defined in this section
3 and RCW 43.88.110.

4 (2) Each project is defined as proposed in the legislative budget
5 notes or in the governor's budget document.

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8007.** (1) The office of financial management
7 may authorize a transfer of appropriation authority provided for a
8 capital project that is in excess of the amount required for the
9 completion of such project to another capital project for which the
10 appropriation is insufficient. No such transfer may be used to expand
11 the capacity of any facility beyond that intended in making the
12 appropriation. Such transfers may be effected only between capital
13 appropriations to a specific department, commission, agency, or
14 institution of higher education and only between capital projects
15 that are funded from the same fund or account. No transfers may occur
16 between projects to local government agencies except where the grants
17 are provided within a single omnibus appropriation and where such
18 transfers are specifically authorized by the implementing statutes
19 that govern the grants.

20 (2) The office of financial management may find that an amount is
21 in excess of the amount required for the completion of a project only
22 if: (a) The project as defined in the notes to the budget document is
23 substantially complete and there are funds remaining; or (b) bids
24 have been let on a project and it appears to a substantial certainty
25 that the project as defined in the notes to the budget document can
26 be completed within the biennium for less than the amount
27 appropriated in this act.

28 (3) For the purposes of this section, the intent is that each
29 project be defined as proposed to the legislature in the governor's
30 budget document, unless it clearly appears from the legislative
31 history that the legislature intended to define the scope of a
32 project in a different way.

33 (4) A report of any transfer effected under this section, except
34 emergency projects or any transfer under \$250,000, shall be filed
35 with the fiscal committees of the legislature by the office of
36 financial management at least 30 days before the date the transfer is
37 effected. The office of financial management shall report all
38 emergency or smaller transfers within 30 days from the date of
39 transfer.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8008.** (1) It is expected that projects be
2 ready to proceed in a timely manner depending on the type or phase of
3 the project or program that is the subject of the appropriation in
4 this act. Except for major projects that customarily may take more
5 than two biennia to complete from predesign to the end of
6 construction, or large infrastructure grant or loan programs
7 supporting projects that often take more than two biennia to
8 complete, the legislature generally does not intend to reappropriate
9 funds more than once, particularly for smaller grant programs, local/
10 community projects, and minor works.

11 (2) Agencies shall expedite the expenditure of reappropriations
12 and appropriations in this act in order to: (a) Rehabilitate
13 infrastructure resources; (b) accelerate environmental rehabilitation
14 and restoration projects for the improvement of the state's natural
15 environment; (c) reduce additional costs associated with acquisition
16 and construction inflationary pressures; and (d) provide additional
17 employment opportunities associated with capital expenditures.

18 (3) To the extent feasible, agencies are directed to accelerate
19 expenditure rates at their current level of permanent employees and
20 shall use contracted design and construction services wherever
21 necessary to meet the goals of this section.

22 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8009.** Any building project that receives over
23 \$10,000,000 in funding from the capital budget must be built to
24 sustainable standards. "Sustainable building" means a building that
25 integrates and optimizes all major high-performance building
26 attributes, including energy efficiency, durability, life-cycle
27 performance, and occupant productivity, and minimizes greenhouse gas
28 emissions. The following design and construction attributes must be
29 integrated into the building project:

30 (1) Employ integrated design principles: Use a collaborative,
31 integrated planning and design process that initiates and maintains
32 an integrated project team in all stages of a project's planning and
33 delivery. Establish performance goals for siting, energy, water,
34 materials, and indoor environmental quality along with other
35 comprehensive design goals and ensures incorporation of these goals
36 throughout the design and life-cycle of the building. Consider all
37 stages of the building's life-cycle, including deconstruction.

38 (2) Commissioning: Employ commissioning practices tailored to the
39 size and complexity of the building and its system components in

1 order to verify performance of building components and systems and
2 help ensure that design requirements are met. This should include an
3 experienced commissioning provider, inclusion of commissioning
4 requirements in construction documents, a commissioning plan,
5 verification of the installation and performance of systems to be
6 commissioned, and a commissioning report.

7 (3) Optimize energy performance: Establish a whole building
8 performance target that takes into account the intended use,
9 occupancy, operations, plug loads, other energy demands, and design
10 to earn the ENERGY STAR targets for new construction and major
11 renovation where applicable. For new construction target low energy
12 use index. For major renovations, target reducing energy use by 50
13 percent below prerenovations baseline.

14 (4) On-site renewable energy: Implement renewable energy
15 generation projects on agency property for agency use, when life-
16 cycle cost effective.

17 (5) High-efficiency electric equipment: Use only high-efficiency
18 electric equipment for water and space heating needs not met through
19 on-site renewable energy, when life-cycle cost effective.

20 (6) Measurement and verification: For buildings over 50,000
21 square feet, install building level electricity meters in new major
22 construction and renovation projects to track and continuously
23 optimize performance. Include equivalent meters for natural gas and
24 steam, where natural gas and steam are used. Where appropriate,
25 install dashboards inside buildings to display and incentivize
26 occupants on energy use.

27 (7) Benchmarking: Compare performance data from the first year of
28 operation with the energy design target. Verify that the building
29 performance meets or exceeds the design target. For other building
30 and space types, use an equivalent benchmarking tool.

31 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8010.** State agencies, including institutions
32 of higher education, shall allot and report full-time equivalent
33 staff for capital projects in a manner comparable to staff reporting
34 for operating expenditures.

35 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8011.** Executive Order No. 21-02,
36 archaeological and cultural resources, was issued effective April 7,
37 2021. Agencies shall comply with the requirements set forth in this
38 executive order and must consult with the department of archaeology

1 and historic preservation and affected tribes on the potential
2 effects of projects on cultural resources and historic properties
3 proposed in state-funded construction or acquisition projects,
4 including grant or pass-through funding that culminates in
5 construction or land acquisitions. Consultation with the department
6 of archaeology and historic preservation and affected tribes must be
7 initiated early in the project planning process, prior to
8 construction or taking title.

9 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8012.** FOR THE ARTS COMMISSION—ART WORK
10 ALLOWANCE. (1) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this
11 act for original construction of school plant facilities is provided
12 solely for the purposes of RCW 28A.335.210.

13 (2) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act
14 for original construction or any major renovation or remodel work
15 exceeding \$200,000 by colleges or universities is provided solely for
16 the purposes of RCW 28B.10.027.

17 (3) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act
18 for original construction of any public building by a state agency
19 identified in RCW 43.17.200 is provided solely for the purposes of
20 RCW 43.17.200.

21 (4) At least 75 percent of the moneys spent by the Washington
22 state arts commission during the 2023-2025 fiscal biennium for the
23 purposes of RCW 28A.335.210, 28B.10.027, and 43.17.200 must be
24 expended solely for direct acquisition of works of art; 20 percent
25 may be expended for program administration; and 5 percent may be
26 expended to conserve or maintain existing pieces in the state art
27 collection.

28 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8013.** To carry out the provisions of this
29 act, the governor may assign responsibility for predesign, design,
30 construction, and other related activities to any appropriate agency.

31 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8014.** If any federal moneys appropriated by
32 this act for capital projects are not received by the state, the
33 department or agency to which the moneys were appropriated may
34 replace the federal moneys with funds available from private or local
35 sources. No replacement may occur under this section without the
36 prior approval of the director of financial management in

1 consultation with the senate ways and means committee and the house
2 of representatives capital budget committee.

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8015.** (1) Unless otherwise stated, for all
4 appropriations under this act that require a match of nonstate money
5 or in-kind contributions, the following requirement, consistent with
6 RCW 43.88.150, shall apply: Expenditures of state money shall be
7 timed so that the state share of project expenditures never exceeds
8 the intended state share of total project costs.

9 (2) Provision of the full amount of required matching funds is
10 not required to permit the expenditure of capital budget
11 appropriations for phased projects if a proportional amount of the
12 required matching funds is provided for each distinct, identifiable
13 phase of the project.

14 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8016.** NONTAXABLE AND TAXABLE BOND PROCEEDS.
15 Portions of the appropriation authority granted by this act from the
16 state building construction account, or any other account receiving
17 bond proceeds, may be transferred to the state taxable building
18 construction account as deemed necessary by the state treasurer, on
19 behalf of the state finance committee, to comply with the federal
20 internal revenue service rules and regulations pertaining to the use
21 of nontaxable bond proceeds. Portions of the general obligation bond
22 proceeds authorized by Substitute House Bill No. 1148 (state general
23 obligation bonds and related accounts) for deposit into the state
24 taxable building construction account that are in excess of amounts
25 required to comply with the federal internal revenue service rules
26 and regulations shall be deposited into the state building
27 construction account. The state treasurer shall submit written
28 notification to the director of financial management if it is
29 determined that a shift of appropriation authority between the state

32 necessary, or that a shift of appropriation authority from the state

34 construction account may be made.

35 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8017.** (1) Minor works project lists are
36 single line appropriations that include multiple projects of a
37 similar nature and that are valued between \$25,000 and \$1,000,000

1 each, with the exception of higher education minor works projects

28 (3)(a) Public agencies, under this section, shall monitor and
29 document ongoing operating savings resulting from major facility
30 projects designed, constructed, and certified as required under this
31 section.

32 (b) Public agencies, under this section, shall report annually to
33 the department on major facility projects and operating savings.

34 (4) The department shall consolidate the reports required in
35 subsection (3) of this section into one report and report to the
36 governor and legislature by September 1st of each even-numbered year
37 beginning in 2006 and ending in 2016. In its report, the department
38 shall also report on the implementation of this chapter, including
39 reasons why the LEED standard was not used as required by RCW

30 involved and after consultation with the office of financial
31 management, shall purchase, lease, lease purchase, rent, or otherwise
32 acquire all real estate, improved or unimproved, as may be required
33 by elected state officials, institutions, departments, commissions,
34 boards, and other state agencies, or federal agencies where joint

3 projects should represent a complete renovation of a total facility

7 useful life. New space may be programmed for the same or a different
8 use than the space being renovated and may include additions to
9 improve access and enhance the relationship of program or support

11 (d) Major stand-alone campus infrastructure projects;

12 (e) Projects that promote economic growth and innovation through
13 expanded research activity. The acquisition and installation of
14 specialized equipment is authorized under this category; and

15 (f) Other project categories as determined by the office of
16 financial management in consultation with the legislative fiscal
17 committees.

5 **Sec. 8036.** RCW 43.155.050 and 2022 c 296 s 7009, 2022 c 182 s
6 302, and 2022 c 157 s 15 are each reenacted and amended to read as
7 follows:

8 (1) The public works assistance account is hereby established in
9 the state treasury. Money may be placed in the public works
10 assistance account from the proceeds of bonds when authorized by the
11 legislature or from any other lawful source. Money in the public
12 works assistance account shall be used to make loans and grants and
13 to give financial guarantees to local governments for public works
14 projects. Moneys in the account may also be appropriated or
15 transferred to the water pollution control revolving fund and the
16 drinking water assistance account to provide for state match
17 requirements under federal law. Moneys in the account may be
18 transferred to the move ahead WA account to provide support of public
19 works projects funded in the move ahead WA program. Not more than 20
20 percent of the biennial capital budget appropriation to the public
21 works board from this account may be expended or obligated for
22 preconstruction loans and grants, emergency loans and grants, or
23 loans and grants for capital facility planning under this chapter.
24 Not more than 10 percent of the biennial capital budget appropriation
25 to the public works board from this account may be expended or
26 obligated as grants for preconstruction, emergency, capital facility
27 planning, and construction projects. During the 2017-2019 and
28 2019-2021 fiscal biennia, the legislature may appropriate moneys from
29 the account for activities related to rural economic development, the
30 growth management act, the aviation revitalization loan program, the
31 community economic revitalization board broadband program, and the
32 voluntary stewardship program. During the 2021-2023 (~~biennium~~) and
33 2023-2025 fiscal biennia, the legislature may appropriate moneys from
34 the account for activities related to the community aviation
35 revitalization board. During the 2019-2021 fiscal biennia, the
36 legislature may direct the state treasurer to make transfers of
37 moneys in the public works assistance account to the education legacy
38 trust account. During the 2019-2021 and 2021-2023 fiscal biennia, the
39 legislature may direct the state treasurer to make transfers of

1 moneys in the public works assistance account to the statewide
2 broadband account. The legislature may appropriate moneys from the
3 public works assistance account for activities related to the
4 voluntary stewardship program, rural economic development, and the
5 growth management act. During the 2021-2023 biennium, the legislature
6 may appropriate moneys from the account for projects identified in
7 section 1033, chapter 296, Laws of 2022.

8 (2) For fiscal year 2024 through fiscal year 2038, the state
9 treasurer must transfer from the public works assistance account to
10 the move ahead WA account created in RCW 46.68.510 \$57,000,000 each
11 fiscal year in four equal quarterly transfers.

12 **Sec. 8037.** RCW 43.160.060 and 2014 c 112 s 108 are each amended
13 to read as follows:

14 (1) The board is authorized to make direct loans to political
15 subdivisions of the state and to federally recognized Indian tribes
16 for the purposes of assisting the political subdivisions and
17 federally recognized Indian tribes in financing the cost of public
18 facilities, including development of land and improvements for public
19 facilities, project-specific environmental, capital facilities, land
20 use, permitting, feasibility, and marketing studies and plans;
21 project design, site planning, and analysis; project debt and revenue
22 impact analysis; as well as the construction, rehabilitation,
23 alteration, expansion, or improvement of the facilities. A grant may
24 also be authorized for purposes designated in this chapter, but only
25 when, and to the extent that, a loan is not reasonably possible,
26 given the limited resources of the political subdivision or the
27 federally recognized Indian tribe and the finding by the board that
28 financial circumstances require grant assistance to enable the
29 project to move forward. However, no more than (~~twenty-five~~) 25
30 percent of all financial assistance approved by the board in any
31 biennium may consist of grants to political subdivisions and
32 federally recognized Indian tribes, except that rural broadband
33 grants awarded during the 2023-2025 fiscal biennium do not count
34 toward the 25 percent limit on awarding assistance as grants.

35 (2) Application for funds must be made in the form and manner as
36 the board may prescribe. In making grants or loans the board must
37 conform to the following requirements:

38 (a) The board may not provide financial assistance:

1 (i) For a project the primary purpose of which is to facilitate
2 or promote a retail shopping development or expansion.

3 (ii) For any project that evidence exists would result in a
4 development or expansion that would displace existing jobs in any
5 other community in the state.

6 (iii) For a project the primary purpose of which is to facilitate
7 or promote gambling.

8 (iv) For a project located outside the jurisdiction of the
9 applicant political subdivision or federally recognized Indian tribe.

10 (b) The board may only provide financial assistance:

11 (i) For a project demonstrating convincing evidence that a
12 specific private development or expansion is ready to occur and will
13 occur only if the public facility improvement is made that:

14 (A) Results in the creation of significant private sector jobs or
15 significant private sector capital investment as determined by the
16 board; and

17 (B) Will improve the opportunities for the successful
18 maintenance, establishment, or expansion of industrial or commercial
19 plants or will otherwise assist in the creation or retention of long-
20 term economic opportunities;

21 (ii) For a project that cannot meet the requirement of (b)(i) of
22 this subsection but is a project that:

23 (A) Results in the creation of significant private sector jobs or
24 significant private sector capital investment as determined by the
25 board;

26 (B) Is part of a local economic development plan consistent with
27 applicable state planning requirements;

28 (C) Can demonstrate project feasibility using standard economic
29 principles; and

30 (D) Is located in a rural community as defined by the board, or a
31 rural county;

32 (iii) For site-specific plans, studies, and analyses that address
33 environmental impacts, capital facilities, land use, permitting,
34 feasibility, marketing, project engineering, design, site planning,
35 and project debt and revenue impacts, as grants not to exceed fifty
36 thousand dollars.

37 (c) The board must develop guidelines for local participation and
38 allowable match and activities.

39 (d) An application must demonstrate local match and local
40 participation, in accordance with guidelines developed by the board.

1 (e) An application must be approved by the political subdivision
2 and supported by the local associate development organization or
3 local workforce development council or approved by the governing body
4 of the federally recognized Indian tribe.

5 (f) The board may allow de minimis general system improvements to
6 be funded if they are critically linked to the viability of the
7 project.

8 (g) An application must demonstrate convincing evidence that the
9 median hourly wage of the private sector jobs created after the
10 project is completed will exceed the countywide median hourly wage.

11 (h) The board must prioritize each proposed project according to:

12 (i) The relative benefits provided to the community by the jobs
13 the project would create, not just the total number of jobs it would
14 create after the project is completed, but also giving consideration
15 to the unemployment rate in the area in which the jobs would be
16 located;

17 (ii) The rate of return of the state's investment, including, but
18 not limited to, the leveraging of private sector investment,
19 anticipated job creation and retention, and expected increases in
20 state and local tax revenues associated with the project;

21 (iii) Whether the proposed project offers a health insurance plan
22 for employees that includes an option for dependents of employees;

23 (iv) Whether the public facility investment will increase
24 existing capacity necessary to accommodate projected population and
25 employment growth in a manner that supports infill and redevelopment
26 of existing urban or industrial areas that are served by adequate
27 public facilities. Projects should maximize the use of existing
28 infrastructure and provide for adequate funding of necessary
29 transportation improvements;

30 (v) Whether the applicant's permitting process has been certified
31 as streamlined by the office of regulatory assistance; and

32 (vi) Whether the applicant has developed and adhered to
33 guidelines regarding its permitting process for those applying for
34 development permits consistent with section 1(2), chapter 231, Laws
35 of 2007.

36 (i) A responsible official of the political subdivision or the
37 federally recognized Indian tribe must be present during board
38 deliberations and provide information that the board requests.

39 (3) Before any financial assistance application is approved, the
40 political subdivision or the federally recognized Indian tribe

1 seeking the assistance must demonstrate to the community economic
2 revitalization board that no other timely source of funding is
3 available to it at costs reasonably similar to financing available
4 from the community economic revitalization board.

5 (4) During the 2023-2025 fiscal biennium, the board may award
6 broadband grants in accordance with state appropriations and
7 requirements for the broadband equity, access, and deployment program
8 in section 60102 of P.L. 117-58 (infrastructure investment and jobs
9 act) and section 1002, chapter . . ., Laws of 2023 (section 1002 of
10 this act).

11 **Sec. 8038.** RCW 43.185.050 and 2021 c 332 s 7032 and 2021 c 130 s
12 5 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

13 (1) The department must use moneys from the housing trust fund
14 and other legislative appropriations to finance in whole or in part
15 any loans or grant projects that will provide housing for persons and
16 families with special housing needs and with incomes at or below
17 (~~fifty~~) 50 percent of the median family income for the county or
18 standard metropolitan statistical area where the project is located.
19 At least (~~thirty~~) 30 percent of these moneys used in any given
20 funding cycle must be for the benefit of projects located in rural
21 areas of the state as defined by the department. If the department
22 determines that it has not received an adequate number of suitable
23 applications for rural projects during any given funding cycle, the
24 department may allocate unused moneys for projects in nonrural areas
25 of the state.

26 (2) Activities eligible for assistance from the housing trust
27 fund and other legislative appropriations include, but are not
28 limited to:

29 (a) New construction, rehabilitation, or acquisition of low and
30 very low-income housing units;

31 (b) Rent subsidies;

32 (c) Matching funds for social services directly related to
33 providing housing for special-need tenants in assisted projects;

34 (d) Technical assistance, design and finance services and
35 consultation, and administrative costs for eligible nonprofit
36 community or neighborhood-based organizations;

37 (e) Administrative costs for housing assistance groups or
38 organizations when such grant or loan will substantially increase the

1 recipient's access to housing funds other than those available under
2 this chapter;

3 (f) Shelters and related services for the homeless, including
4 emergency shelters and overnight youth shelters;

5 (g) Mortgage subsidies, including temporary rental and mortgage
6 payment subsidies to prevent homelessness;

7 (h) Mortgage insurance guarantee or payments for eligible
8 projects;

9 (i) Down payment or closing cost assistance for eligible first-
10 time home buyers;

11 (j) Acquisition of housing units for the purpose of preservation
12 as low-income or very low-income housing;

13 (k) Projects making housing more accessible to families with
14 members who have disabilities; and

15 (l) Remodeling and improvements as required to meet building
16 code, licensing requirements, or legal operations to residential
17 properties owned and operated by an entity eligible under RCW
18 43.185A.040, which were transferred as described in RCW
19 82.45.010(3)(t) by the parent of a child with developmental
20 disabilities.

21 (3) Preference must be given for projects that include an early
22 learning facility, as defined in RCW 43.31.565.

23 (4) Legislative appropriations from capital bond proceeds may be
24 used only for the costs of projects authorized under subsection
25 (2)(a), (i), and (j) of this section, and not for the administrative
26 costs of the department, except that during the 2021-2023 and
27 2023-2025 fiscal (~~biennium~~) biennia, the department may use up to
28 three percent of the appropriations from capital bond proceeds for
29 administrative costs associated with application, distribution, and
30 project development activities of the housing assistance program.

31 (5) Moneys from repayment of loans from appropriations from
32 capital bond proceeds may be used for all activities necessary for
33 the proper functioning of the housing assistance program except for
34 activities authorized under subsection (2)(b) and (c) of this
35 section.

36 (6) Administrative costs associated with application,
37 distribution, and project development activities of the department
38 may not exceed three percent of the annual funds available for the
39 housing assistance program. Reappropriations must not be included in

1 the calculation of the annual funds available for determining the
2 administrative costs.

3 (7) Administrative costs associated with compliance and
4 monitoring activities of the department may not exceed one-quarter of
5 one percent annually of the contracted amount of state investment in
6 the housing assistance program.

7 **Sec. 8039.** RCW 87.03.136 and 2011 c 50 s 1 are each amended to
8 read as follows:

9 An irrigation district has the power to sell or lease real
10 property owned by the district whenever its board of directors, by
11 resolution: Determines that the property is not necessary or needed
12 for the use of the district; and authorizes the sale or lease. Notice
13 of the district's intention to sell or lease the property shall be
14 made by publication at least (~~twenty~~) 20 days before the
15 transaction is executed regarding the property in a newspaper of
16 general circulation in the county where the property or part of the
17 property is located or, if there is no such newspaper in the county,
18 in a newspaper of general circulation published in an adjoining
19 county. The publication shall be made at least once a week during
20 three consecutive weeks. The notice shall state whether the sale or
21 lease will be negotiated by the district or will be awarded by bid.

22 The district may lease the property for a duration determined by
23 the board, afford the lessee the option to purchase the property,
24 sell the property on contract for deferred payments, sell the
25 property pursuant to a promissory note secured by a mortgage or deed
26 of trust, or sell the property for cash and conveyance by deed. The
27 appropriate documents shall be executed by the president of the board
28 and acknowledged by the secretary.

29 The resolution authorizing the sale or lease shall be entered in
30 the minutes of the board and shall fix the price at which the lease,
31 option, or sale may be made. The price shall be not less than the
32 reasonable market value of the property; however, the board may,
33 without consideration, dedicate, grant, or convey district land or
34 easements in district land for highway or public utility purposes
35 that convenience the inhabitants of the district if the board deems
36 that the action will enhance the value of the remaining district land
37 to an extent equal to or greater than the value of the land or
38 easement dedicated, granted, or conveyed.

1 During the 2023-2025 fiscal biennium, the limitations under this
2 section on the power of an irrigation district to sell or lease real
3 property owned by the district do not apply to property transferred
4 to the bureau of reclamation or to a public owner under section 3080,
5 chapter . . ., Laws of 2023 (section 3080 of this act).

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8040.** If any provision of this act or its
7 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
8 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
9 persons or circumstances is not affected.

10 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8041.** Section 8038 of this act takes effect
11 if Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill No. 5301 (concerning housing
12 programs administered by the department of commerce), is not enacted
13 by June 30, 2023.

14 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8042.** Except for section 8038 of this act,
15 this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
16 peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its
17 existing public institutions, and takes effect immediately.
