## SENATE BILL 5490

- AN ACT Relating to health care coverage for retired or disabled employees denied coverage for failure to timely notify the authority of their intent to defer coverage; adding a new section to chapter 4 1.05 RCW; and declaring an emergency.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 41.05
  RCW to read as follows:
- 8 (1) A retired or disabled employee who: (a) Is receiving a retirement allowance under chapters 41.32, 41.35, 41.37, or 41.40 9 10 RCW; (b) was previously denied coverage solely for failure to timely 11 notify the authority of their plan to defer coverage; and (c) 12 appealed the denial of benefits, may enroll in medical and dental 13 plans under the authority, provided they apply no later than the end 14 of the open enrollment period for the plan year beginning January 1, 15 2024.
- 16 (2) A retired or disabled employee enrolling in benefits under 17 this section may only enroll in a fully-insured medicare advantage or 18 medicare supplement plan.
- 19 (3) Retired or disabled employees and their dependents are 20 responsible for payment of rates developed by the authority, and must 21 include any amounts necessary for administration in accordance with

- this chapter. Premium rates charged to retired or disabled employees and their dependents shall be based on the experience of the community-rated risk pools established under RCW 41.05.022 and 4 1.05.080 and must be reduced by the amount of the subsidy provided under RCW 41.05.085.
- 6 (4) The authority may establish rules to implement the enrollment 7 opportunity under this section.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect immediately.
