- 6 The court shall sit in panels of three judges and decisions shall 7 be rendered by not less than a majority of the panel. In the determination of causes all decisions of the court shall be given in 8 writing and the grounds of the decisions shall be stated. All 9 10 decisions of the court having precedential value shall be published 11 opinions of the court. Each panel shall determine whether a decision of the court has sufficient precedential value 12 13 published as an opinion of the court. Decisions determined not to 14 have precedential value shall not be published. ((Panels in the first 15 division shall be comprised of such judges as the chief judge thereof shall from time to time direct.))
