1 AN ACT Relating to the creation of a data dashboard to track
2 policies, funding, and program and health outcomes related to the
3 sale, consumption, and use of regulated substances; and adding a new
4 section to chapter 66.08 RCW.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 66.08
7 RCW to read as follows:

8 (1) Subject to subsections (3) and (4) of this section, the
9 board, in consultation with the department of health, the health care
10 authority, and other agencies the board deems appropriate, shall
11 publish in a conspicuous location on the board's website and update,
12 at least annually, the information identified in subsection (2) of
13 this section.

14 (2) The following information, identified separately for each
15 substance regulated by the board, must be published under this
16 section:

17 (a) Compliance rates, with all personally identifiable
18 information redacted, regarding the board's enforcement of laws or
19 rules prohibiting the sale of liquor, cannabis, cigarettes, tobacco
20 products, and vapor products to persons under 21 years of age;

1 (b) The number of citations, with all personally identifiable
2 information redacted, issued annually for violations of laws or rules
3 prohibiting the sale of liquor, cannabis, cigarettes, tobacco
4 products, or vapor products to persons under 21 years of age;

5 (c) The number of citations, with all personally identifiable
6 information redacted, issued annually for violations of laws or rules
7 prohibiting the sale, service, or delivery of liquor to an
8 intoxicated person or a person who is apparently under the influence
9 of liquor, and for violations of laws or rules prohibiting the
10 purchase or consumption of liquor by a person who is apparently under
11 the influence of liquor;

12 (d) Data from the healthy youth survey about youth use, access,
13 and perceptions of liquor, cannabis, cigarettes, tobacco products,
14 and vapor products in Washington;

15 (e) Information reported to the board from the department of
16 health or the health care authority about the prevalence in
17 Washington state of the use of alcohol, cannabis, cigarettes, tobacco
18 products, and vapor products;

19 (f) Information reported to the board by the department of health
20 and the health care authority about the amount and source of funding
21 appropriated or available per fiscal year to the department of health
22 and the health care authority for programs for preventing and
23 deterring the use of liquor, cannabis, cigarettes, tobacco products,
24 and vapor products and treating substance use disorders related to
25 these regulated substances;

26 (g) Available data reported to the board by the department of
27 health or the health care authority about:

28 (i) Annual health care expenditures in the state caused by
29 liquor, cannabis, cigarettes, tobacco products, and vapor products;

30 (ii) Annual state medicaid total health expenditures caused by
31 consumption or use of liquor, cannabis, cigarettes, tobacco products,
32 and vapor products;

33 (iii) Cessation expenditures for cigarettes or tobacco products
34 through the school employees' benefits board and the public
35 employees' benefits board;

36 (iv) Annual deaths in Washington caused by smoking or consuming
37 cigarettes, tobacco products, alcohol, vapor products, or cannabis;

38 (v) State spending on tobacco prevention and cessation funding as
39 compared to funding levels recommended by the United States centers
40 for disease control and prevention;

1 (vi) Health equity metrics including disparities in the rates of
2 diseases or disorders caused by or associated with the consumption or
3 use of alcohol, cannabis, cigarettes, tobacco products, and vapor
4 products; and

5 (vii) Demographic impact metrics including disparities in the
6 rates of consumption or use of alcohol, cannabis, cigarettes, tobacco
7 products, and vapor products;

8 (h) The amount of the following taxes, fees, and penalties
9 collected by the state in the most recent fiscal year:

10 (i) Taxes collected from the sale of liquor, cannabis,
11 cigarettes, tobacco products, and vapor products;

12 (ii) License fees collected related to the manufacture,
13 distribution, and sale of liquor, cannabis, cigarettes, tobacco
14 products, and vapor products; and

15 (iii) Money received from penalties imposed by the board on
16 licensees for violations of laws related to the manufacture,
17 distribution, or sale of liquor, cannabis, cigarettes, tobacco
18 products, or vapor products; and

19 (i) The number of occurrences of, and economic impact on the
20 regulated market from, the:

21 (i) Inversion of cannabis or cannabis products into the regulated
22 cannabis system involving a person licensed under RCW 69.50.325 as a
23 cannabis producer, processor, or retailer, purchasing or obtaining
24 cannabis or cannabis products from an unauthorized person or source;
25 and

26 (ii) Diversion of cannabis or cannabis products out of the
27 regulated cannabis system involving a person licensed under RCW
28 69.50.325 as a cannabis producer, processor, or retailer, selling or
29 transferring cannabis or cannabis products to an unauthorized person
30 or recipient.

31 (3)(a) If information required to be published on the board's
32 website under this section is published on the website of the
33 department of health, the health care authority, or any other agency,
34 to avoid duplication, the board's website may reference and link to
35 the department, authority, or other agency's website publishing the
36 information.

37 (b) If information required to be published on the board's
38 website under this section is unavailable, the board, in consultation
39 with the department of health, the health care authority, and any

1 other agencies the board deems appropriate, shall report this fact to
2 the appropriate legislative committees.

3 (c) Within existing resources and subject to subsection (4) of
4 this section, the board, the department of health, and the health
5 care authority, as appropriate, shall identify and collect data that,
6 if available, would be required to be published on the board's
7 website pursuant to this section.

8 (4) All the implementation and administration of this section by
9 the board, the department of health, the health care authority, and
10 any other agencies the board deems appropriate to consult with in the
11 implementation and administration of this section, shall be conducted
12 within existing resources. The board, the department of health, the
13 health care authority, and any other agency consulted with in
14 implementing or administering this section shall not expend funds,
15 other than funds within the agency's existing resources, for the
16 implementation and administration of this section, including but not
17 limited to expending funds for any of the following: Employing new
18 staff, hiring workers, or otherwise increasing the agency's full or
19 part-time employees; contracting for goods, services, or labor;
20 traveling; creating reimbursements; entering interagency agreements;
21 making information technology-related expenditures; making capital or
22 operating expenditures; locating, compiling, reviewing, organizing,
23 storing, maintaining, sharing, reporting, publishing, or updating
24 data or information; or making any other expenditure for purposes of
25 implementing this section not within the agency's existing resources.
26 If information or data required under this section is unavailable to,
27 or unobtainable by, the board, the department of health, the health
28 care authority, or any other agencies the board deems appropriate to
29 consult with in the implementation and administration of this
30 section, within the board, department, authority, or agency's
31 existing resources, the data or information is not required to be
32 published on the board's website.

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
