1 AN ACT Relating to creating a task force on housing cost driver 2 analysis; creating new sections; and providing an expiration date.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. (1) (a) A legislative task force on housing
cost driver analysis is established, with members as provided in this
subsection.

7 (i) The president of the senate shall appoint one member from 8 each of the two largest caucuses of the senate.

9 (ii) The speaker of the house of representatives shall appoint 10 one member from each of the two largest caucuses of the house of 11 representatives.

(iii) The president of the senate and the speaker of the house ofrepresentatives jointly shall appoint the following members:

14 (A) Two economists with expertise in the economic disciplines15 most relevant to the issue of housing cost drivers;

16 (B) One member representing nonprofit developers of rental 17 housing;

18 (C) One member representing nonprofit developers of housing for 19 homeownership;

20 (D) One member representing for-profit housing developers;

21 (E) One member representing builders;

1 (F) One member representing a statewide organization representing the building trades labor; 2 3 (G) One member representing realtors; (H) One member representing cities; 4 (I) One member representing counties; 5 6 (J) One member representing tenants; 7 (K) One member representing landlords who provide at least 10 rental housing units; 8 9 (L) One member representing landlords who provide no more than two rental housing units; 10 11 (M) One member from a statewide association representing real 12 estate appraisers; (N) One member representing home mortgage lenders; 13 14 (O) One member representing multifamily lenders; (P) One member representing utility providers; 15 16 (Q) One member representing public housing authorities; 17 (R) One member representing the Washington state housing finance commission; 18 19 (S) One member from a statewide association representing business; and 20 (T) One member from an organization representing architects. 21 22 (b) The task force shall choose its cochairs from among its legislative membership. The legislative membership shall convene the 23 initial meeting of the task force. The task force may not meet more 24 25 than three times, and all task force meetings must be held virtually. 26 (2) The task force shall research, analyze, and determine the primary cost drivers for homeownership and rental housing 27 in Washington state. 28 29 (3) Staff support for the task force must be provided by the senate committee services and the house of representatives office of 30 31 program research. 32 (4) The task force, in completing the duties prescribed by this section, shall solicit and consider information and perspectives 33 provided by the affordable housing advisory board and persons and 34 entities with relevant interest and expertise. 35 (5) Legislative members of the task force are reimbursed for 36 travel expenses in accordance with RCW 44.04.120. Nonlegislative 37 members are not entitled to be reimbursed for travel expenses if they 38

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are elected officials or are participating on behalf of an employer,

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governmental entity, or other organization. Any reimbursement for
 other nonlegislative members is subject to chapter 43.03 RCW.

3 (6) The expenses of the task force must be paid jointly by the 4 senate and the house of representatives. Task force expenditures are 5 subject to approval by the senate facilities and operations committee 6 and the house of representatives executive rules committee, or their 7 successor committees.

8 (7) The task force shall report its findings and recommendations 9 to the appropriate committees of the legislature by December 1, 2026.

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(8) This section expires June 1, 2027.

11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. If specific funding for the purposes of 12 this act, referencing this act by bill or chapter number, is not 13 provided by June 30, 2025, in the omnibus appropriations act, this 14 act is null and void.

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
