AN ACT Relating to standardizing basic training and certification requirements for long-term care workers who provide in-home care for their family members, including spouses or domestic partners; and amending RCW 18.88B.041 and 74.39A.076.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 Sec. 1. RCW 18.88B.041 and 2024 c 322 s 1 are each amended to 7 read as follows:

8 (1) The following long-term care workers are not required to 9 become a certified home care aide pursuant to this chapter:

10 (a) (i) (A) Registered nurses, licensed practical nurses, certified 11 nursing assistants or persons who are in an approved training program 12 for certified nursing assistants under chapter 18.88A RCW, medicare-13 certified home health aides, or other persons who hold a similar 14 health credential, as determined by the secretary, or persons with 15 special education training and an endorsement granted by the 16 superintendent of public instruction, as described in RCW 17 28A.300.010, if the secretary determines that the circumstances do 18 not require certification.

(B) A person who was initially hired as a long-term care worker prior to January 7, 2012, and who completes all of the training requirements in effect as of the date the person was hired. (ii) Individuals exempted by (a)(i) of this subsection may obtain
 certification as a home care aide without fulfilling the training
 requirements in RCW 74.39A.074(1)(d)(ii) but must successfully
 complete a certification examination pursuant to RCW 18.88B.031.

5 (b) All long-term care workers employed by community residential 6 service businesses.

7 (c)(i) ((An individual provider)) <u>A long-term care worker</u> 8 providing in-home care and caring only for the ((individual 9 provider's)) worker's child or parent, including when related by 10 marriage or domestic partnership; ((and))

(ii) ((An individual provider)) <u>A long-term care worker providing</u> <u>in-home care and</u> caring only for the ((individual provider's)) <u>worker's</u> sibling, aunt, uncle, cousin, niece, nephew, grandparent, or grandchild, including when related by marriage or domestic partnership; and

16 (iii) A long-term care worker providing in-home care and caring 17 only for the worker's spouse or domestic partner.

(d) A person working as ((an individual provider)) <u>a long-term</u> <u>care worker providing in-home care</u> who provides 20 hours or less of nonrespite care for one person in any calendar month.

(e) A person working as ((an individual provider)) <u>a long-term</u>
 <u>care worker providing in-home care</u> who only provides respite services
 and works less than 300 hours in any calendar year.

24 (((f) A long-term care worker providing approved services only 25 for a spouse or registered domestic partner, pursuant to the long-26 term services and supports trust program established in chapter 27 50B.04 RCW.

28 (g) A long-term care worker providing approved services only for 29 a spouse or registered domestic partner and funded through the United 30 States department of veterans affairs home and community-based 31 programs.))

(2) A long-term care worker exempted by this section from the
 training requirements contained in RCW 74.39A.074 may not be
 prohibited from enrolling in training pursuant to that section.

35 (3) The department shall adopt rules to implement this section.

36 Sec. 2. RCW 74.39A.076 and 2024 c 322 s 2 are each amended to 37 read as follows:

(1) Beginning January 7, 2012, except for long-term care workers
 exempt from certification under RCW 18.88B.041(1)(a):

1 (a) A parent who is the ((individual provider)) long-term care 2 worker providing in-home care only for the person's developmentally 3 disabled child, including when related by marriage or domestic 4 partnership, must receive 12 hours of training relevant to the needs 5 of individuals with developmental disabilities within the first 120 6 days after becoming ((an individual provider)) a long-term care 7 worker.

8 (b) A spouse or registered domestic partner who is a long-term 9 care worker <u>providing in-home care</u> only for a spouse or domestic 10 partner((, <u>pursuant to the long-term services and supports trust</u> 11 program established in chapter 50B.04 RCW,)) must receive 15 hours of 12 basic training, and at least six hours of additional focused training 13 based on the care-receiving spouse's or partner's needs, within the 14 first 120 days after becoming ((a)) <u>an in-home</u> long-term care worker.

15 (c) A person working as ((an individual provider)) a long-term 16 care worker providing in-home care who (i) provides respite care 17 services only for individuals with developmental disabilities receiving services under Title 71A RCW or only for individuals who 18 receive services under this chapter, and (ii) works 300 hours or less 19 in any calendar year, must complete 14 hours of training within the 20 21 first 120 days after becoming ((an individual provider)) a long-term care worker providing in-home care. Five of the 14 hours must be 22 completed before becoming eligible to provide care, including two 23 hours of orientation training regarding the caregiving role and terms 24 of employment and three hours of safety training. The training 25 partnership identified in RCW 74.39A.360 must offer at least 12 of 26 27 14 hours online, and five of those online hours must be the 28 individually selected from elective courses.

(d) ((Individual providers)) Long-term care workers identified in 29 30 (d) (i) or (ii) of this subsection must complete 35 hours of training 31 within the first 120 days after becoming ((an individual provider)) a long-term care worker. Five of the 35 hours must be completed before 32 becoming eligible to provide care. Two of these five hours shall be 33 34 devoted to an orientation training regarding ((an individual provider's)) a long-term care worker's role as caregiver and the 35 applicable terms of employment, and three hours shall be devoted to 36 safety training, including basic safety precautions, emergency 37 procedures, and infection control. ((Individual providers)) Long-term 38 39 care workers subject to this requirement include:

(i) (A) Unless covered by (a) of this subsection, ((an individual
 provider)) a long-term care worker providing in-home care and caring
 only for the ((individual provider's)) worker's child or parent,
 including when related by marriage or domestic partnership;

5 (B) ((An individual provider)) <u>A long-term care worker providing</u> 6 <u>in-home care and</u> caring only for the ((individual provider's)) <u>long-</u> 7 <u>term care worker's</u> sibling, aunt, uncle, cousin, niece, nephew, 8 grandparent, or grandchild, including when related by marriage or 9 domestic partnership; <u>and</u>

10 (ii) A person working as ((an individual provider)) <u>a long-term</u> 11 <u>care worker providing in-home care</u> who provides 20 hours or less of 12 care for one person in any calendar month((; and)

13 (iii) A long-term care worker providing approved services only 14 for a spouse or registered domestic partner and funded through the 15 United States department of veterans affairs home and community-based 16 programs)).

17 (2) In computing the time periods in this section, the first day18 is the date of hire.

(3) Only training curriculum approved by the department may be
used to fulfill the training requirements specified in this section.
The department shall only approve training curriculum that:

(a) Has been developed with input from consumer and workerrepresentatives; and

(b) Requires comprehensive instruction by qualified instructors.

(4) If a pandemic, natural disaster, or other declared state of emergency impacts the ability of long-term care workers to complete training as required by this section, the department may adopt rules to allow long-term care workers additional time to complete the training requirements.

(a) Rules adopted under this subsection (4) are effective until 30 the termination of the pandemic, natural disaster, or other declared 31 32 state of emergency or until the department determines that all long-33 term care workers who were unable to complete the training required in subsection (1) of this section have had adequate access to 34 complete the required training, whichever is later. Once the 35 department determines a rule adopted under this subsection (4) is no 36 longer necessary, it must repeal the rule under RCW 34.05.353. 37

(b) Within 12 months of the termination of the pandemic, naturaldisaster, or other declared state of emergency, the department shall

- 1 conduct a review of training compliance with subsection (1) of this 2 section and provide the legislature with a report.
- 3 (5) The department shall adopt rules to implement this section.
