1 AN ACT Relating to the veterans affairs advisory committee; and 2 amending RCW 43.60A.080.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 43.60A.080 and 2015 c 219 s 1 are each amended to 5 read as follows:

6 (1) There is hereby created a veterans affairs advisory committee 7 which shall serve in an advisory capacity to the governor and the director of the department of veterans affairs. The committee shall 8 appoint members to serve as liaisons to each of the state veterans' 9 10 homes((, unless the home has a representative appointed to the 11 committee)). This liaison must share information on committee 12 meetings and business with the resident council of the state's 13 veterans' homes, as well as bring information back for the 14 committee's consideration to ensure veterans' home resident issues 15 are included at regular committee meetings. The committee shall be 16 composed of seventeen members to be appointed by the governor, and 17 shall consist of the following:

18 (a) ((One representative of the Washington soldiers' home and 19 colony at Orting and one representative of the Washington veterans' 20 home at Retsil. Each home's resident council may nominate up to three 21 individuals whose names are to be forwarded by the director to the 1 governor. In making the appointments, the governor shall consider 2 these recommendations or request additional nominations. If the 3 resident council does not provide any nomination, the governor may 4 appoint a member at large in place of the home's representative.

(b)) One representative each from the three congressionally 5 6 chartered or nationally recognized veterans service organizations as listed in the current "Directory of Veterans Service Organizations" 7 published by the United States department of veterans affairs with 8 the largest number of active members in the state of Washington as 9 10 determined by the director. The organizations' state commanders may 11 each submit a list of three names to be forwarded to the governor by 12 the director. In making the appointments, the governor shall consider these recommendations or request additional nominations. 13

(((c))) (b) Ten members shall be chosen ((to represent those 14 15 congressionally chartered or nationally recognized veterans service 16 organizations listed in the directory under (b) of this subsection 17 and having at least one active chapter within the state of Washington. Up to three nominations may be forwarded from each 18 organization to the governor by the director. In making the 19 appointments, the governor shall consider these recommendations or 20 21 request additional nominations.

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(d) Two)) as follows:

(i) Members from congressionally chartered or nationally recognized veterans service organizations listed in the directory under (a) of this subsection and having at least one active chapter within the state of Washington. Up to three nominations may be forwarded from each organization to the governor by the director. In making the appointments, the governor shall consider these recommendations or request additional nominations;

30 (ii) One member may be a veteran who is a member of a native
31 American tribe recognized in Washington state.

32 (iii) One member may be a current or former member of the 33 Washington national guard.

34 <u>(c) Four</u> members shall be veterans at large((, as well as any 35 other at large member appointed pursuant to (a) of this subsection)). 36 Any individual or organization may nominate a veteran for an at large 37 position. Organizational affiliation shall not be a prerequisite for 38 nomination or appointment. All nominations for the at large positions 39 shall be forwarded by the director to the governor. 1 (((e))) <u>(d)</u> No organization shall have more than one official 2 representative on the committee at any one time.

3 (((f))) <u>(e)</u> In making appointments to the committee, care shall 4 be taken to ensure that members represent all geographical portions 5 of the state and minority viewpoints, and that the issues and views 6 of concern to women veterans are represented.

(2) All members shall have terms of four years. In the case of a 7 vacancy, appointment shall be only for the remainder of the unexpired 8 term for which the vacancy occurs. No member may serve more than two 9 consecutive terms, with vacancy appointments to an unexpired term not 10 11 considered as a term. ((Members appointed before June 11, 1992, shall 12 continue to serve until the expiration of their current terms; and then, subject to the conditions contained in this section, are 13 14 eligible for reappointment.))

15 (3) The committee shall adopt an order of business for conducting 16 its meetings.

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(4) The committee shall have the following powers and duties:

(a) To serve in an advisory capacity to the governor and the
director on matters pertaining to the department of veterans affairs;
(b) To acquaint themselves fully with the operations of the
department and recommend such changes to the governor and the
director as they deem advisable.

(5) Members of the committee shall receive no compensation for the performance of their duties but shall receive a per diem allowance and mileage expense according to the provisions of chapter 43.03 RCW.

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
